## Yes/And

*In the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost...*  
“Ghost” - why did we pray to a ghost?



Etymology rears its head here. The Vulgate translated the Aramaic (ruach) and Greek (pneuma) for breath into the Latin spiritus. The Old English word for spirit- gast - became an alternative, hence “Holy Ghost.”

Taking church history courses at Mercer has illuminated the very convoluted development and wording of the Trinity as a way to understand the relationship between the Father and Jesus. God is one Substance in three Divine Persons - all equal and coeternal.

Writing around 100 CE, Ignatius of Antioch clearly enumerates these persons: “to Christ, and to the Father, and to the Spirit.” An early church father, Theophilus of Antioch (second century), defined the Trinity as God, His Word (Logos) and His Wisdom (Sophia).

Over the centuries, artists have drawn from biblical imagery to cement two familiar icons of the Holy Spirit: the winged dove and flames of fire.

Another astonishing icon, *The Hospitality of Abraham*, or *The Trinity*, by Andrei Rublev (fifteenth century) “shows the Holy One in the form of Three, eating and drinking, in infinite hospitality and utter enjoyment between themselves. If we take the depiction of God in The Trinity seriously, we have to say, ‘In the beginning was the Relationship.’ The gaze between the Three shows the deep respect among them as they all share from a common bowl....At the front of the table there appears to be a little rectangular hole. Most people pass right over it, but some art historians believe the remaining glue on the original icon indicates that there was perhaps once a mirror glued to the front of the table. It’s stunning when you think about it —there was room at this table for a fourth. **The observer. You!**”

What captivates me is the word “relationship.” Years ago, I was able to audit classes and lectures at General Theological Seminary. One that has really stuck with me was on the infinite love of Trinity defined as a
