Reading offers us vicarious experience. We learn how to handle life by observing what others have done.



Two books I love to read to my granddaughter are **Rosie Revere Engineer** and **She Persisted**.

Rosie is the great-great-great niece of Rosie the riveter from WWII fame. Rosie dreams up Rube Goldberg-like inventions and is very upset when all her wonderful contraptions flop. But her great aunt just laughs and says the flop is the test. "You will succeed the next time, Rosie!"

She Persisted details the stories of women like Harriet Tubman and Helen Keller who kept on keeping on no matter what obstacles were thrown in their paths.

Do you see where we are going??

There are many images that could describe how we feel today:

-a lawn chair picked up by the tornado whirling in the chaotic mess, then plunked down in an unfamiliar place like Dorothy in Oz;

-a boat whose sails have ripped and pulled down the mast, leaving us drifting;

- a person suddenly struck blind in a new situation with no familiar landmarks.

But scripture - our shared reading - reminds us that the Lord is our rock of refuge and our fortress. The Lord has known us since before we were conceived and is always with us. The Lord is our hope.

YES, we have been here before - some of us with the chaos of the merger, all of us with the chaos of a priest leaving last spring.

One of the things I hope we have all realized is that Resurrection is us. For months now, we have functioned and functioned very well. Our physical plant has been cared for; our finances are steady; most importantly, we have grown together in our worship and in our trust of each other and our faith in the Lord. The Lucan writer tells of a woman who had a "spirit of infirmity for 18 years. She was bent over and could not fully straighten herself." Life had thrown her some hard slaps. But, she persisted. She continued to walk, and she came to hear Jesus. She must have believed that he had something to offer her. And, he did. He saw her faith. He saw her persistence, and he healed her.

AND, all the ordinary common people who feared they couldn't be successful ... and all the people who faced insurmountable obstacles ... "rejoiced at the glorious things that Jesus did." They stood up straight. They believed in him. They trusted him. And they persisted in their faith.

Today, and in the coming weeks, let us be like them.
