Rector's Reflections

A Condensed version of the State of the Parish

Address given at the Annual Meeting

Sunday, February 1, 2015, Mark 1:21-28

Dear Resurrection People,

The authority Jesus modeled in the Gospel reading the day of our meeting (*Mark 1:21-28*) was astonishing because it was not like anything the people had experienced, much like today. People then and now expect authority to come from rank and status, yet Jesus had neither. What he had was of God, from a deeply rooted relationship with God. What he did with it was not to build himself up or to lord it over others, but to serve them, to reflect how God sees them and invite them to see and be their true selves, a people living God's vision of reality. We have that same authority by our baptism. How are we exercising our God-given authority?

The church is the people and the clergy combined, with Christ as the head. We are empowered by our baptism in the authority of Jesus Christ to help God love the world into wholeness. My call is to help you discover, claim, and exercise your God-given authority to do this.

We have built a faithful community out of the

ashes of loss, and our neighbors are blessed by our witness to resurrection life in the Thrift Shop, the Courtvard Garden, the Penny Social, adult education, and even our rainy-day Pet Blessing. We have attracted and kept new participants, most of whom have already committed to the wellbeing of Resurrection ministries. Our Vestry has been a faithful steward of our properties and finances, worthy of your trust. Ninety two percent of our regularly attending members pledge, a very high percentage. We may be small, but we are a worshipcentered people learning and living our Baptismal Covenant of mutual respect, responsibility, affection, justice and service. When people come they feel the love of Christ.

Our strengths are growing. I see we are becoming a more vital parish, more effective in service to Christ because we are being transformed by the Love of Christ. We are learning how to be more realistic and accountable, to ask for and receive forgiveness, because we get that we are all in it together, with Christ. Our practice of praying, discussing, and problem-solving together allows us to be not afraid of change. This is living our resurrection faith: with God there is always life after death. Where in the world can you find this combination? Where else can you be bathed in the grace of God, joined in Communion with all God's beloved, and equipped to make a difference for God's Kingdom?

We have asked you to pray over our 2015 Ministry Goals and Actions, let God show you where you are being called to serve this year without pressure, guilt or fear. Many of you have responded already, the rest of you are just as important to our ministries. If your heart, mind and soul agree, and you are excited about it, that means God is calling you to it. What God commissions, God equips. Doing this is how we exercise our baptismal authority. Our shared journey into the mystery and the hope of the resurrection is our greatest strength, one we


cannot find outside of gathering regularly to worship and serve.





Liaison. Each ministry area has a liaison who is the contact person for the ministry team, the coordinator, and the Vestry.

Coordinator. Each ministry area has a coordinator from the Vestry to oversee and guide the ministry team.
